MONTHLY COMMUNITY POLICING SUPPLEMENT IN THE

BURNABY NEWSLEADER

PURPOSE:

To seek approval to renew the City's agreement for the monthly Community

Policing supplement, "CommSafe", with the Burnaby NewsLeader for 2011.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. THAT the Committee request Council to approve funding for twelve City advertisements in 2011 to accompany the Community Policing supplement in the *Burnaby NewsLeader*.

2. THAT Tracy Keenan, publisher of the *Burnaby NewsLeader*, be informed in writing of Council's decision.

REPORT

1.0 BACKGROUND

At its meeting of 2009 October 5, Burnaby Council approved funding for City advertisements to accompany a new monthly newspaper supplement on community policing in the *Burnaby NewsLeader*. Funding was approved for fifteen months, with the first supplement published in October 2009. To date, thirteen editions of the supplement, "CommSafe", as it has been nicknamed (for "community safety"), have been published, with the remainder of the approved funding earmarked to cover the costs of advertisements in the November and December 2010 editions.

The purpose of this report is to seek the Committee's and Council's approval to renew the City's agreement with the *Burnaby NewsLeader* for 2011 for City advertisements to accompany "CommSafe".

2.0 "COMMSAFE'S" FIRST YEAR

The intent of "CommSafe" is to improve communication with the Burnaby public about community policing and crime prevention. The full-colour, two-page monthly supplement appears in the centre of the newspaper on the second last Friday of each month. It consists of seven features, as follows:

- a *Question and Answer* column focusing on crime and safety issues encountered by Burnaby residents;
- a *Community Police Office* section with locational information and news/events for each of Burnaby's community policing districts;
- a *Community Champion* section in which a local crime prevention champion is celebrated;
- a *Salute to Business* section in which a local business which has implemented a creative idea to prevent crime in the neighbourhood or on its premises is highlighted;
- a *Tip of the Month* section focussing on crime prevention;
- a children's colouring contest with a police or crime prevention theme; and
- a word scramble puzzle on the theme of crime prevention.

As noted above, each edition of the supplement is accompanied by a City-purchased advertisement. The advertisement is used to promote Burnaby's volunteer-based crime prevention programs and to disseminate safety and crime prevention information. The supplement is also supported by the sale by the *NewsLeader* of other advertising space on the centre spread.

The preparation of "CommSafe" is overseen by the Communications Subcommittee of the Community Policing Committee. The Subcommittee includes representatives from each of the four Community Policing Advisory Committees, the RCMP, and the Burnaby Parks, Recreation and Cultural Commission; the Chair and a citizen-member of the Community Policing Committee; and one City staff. The Subcommittee meets quarterly with the publisher of the NewsLeader to discuss topic ideas, and general directions for the supplement.

The NewsLeader provides design, layout, and photographic services for the supplement. Content is supplied by the Communications Subcommittee, through RCMP officers, City staff, and community policing volunteers. Suggestions for persons and businesses to highlight in the Community Champion and Salute to Business sections are solicited from the four Community Policing Advisory Committees, the RCMP, and staff in the Community Police Offices. An editorial group, consisting of two citizen members of the Subcommittee, one police officer, one City staff, and the publisher of the NewsLeader meet monthly to review each edition before it goes to press. The topics, people, and businesses which have been featured over the thirteen editions published to date are detailed in Appendix 1, attached.

3.0 RENEWAL OF THE "COMMSAFE" AGREEMENT FOR 2011

The publisher of the *NewsLeader* has indicated that she is prepared to continue publishing "CommSafe" in 2011, provided the City is prepared to continue purchasing a 3/8 page advertisement in each edition, and to continue to supply ideas for content. The rate for the 3/8 page advertisement would remain the same as it has been since inception of "CommSafe" - \$637.50, exclusive of HST, or \$714.00 inclusive of HST. The Communications Subcommittee proposes that the current format for "CommSafe" be maintained for 2011. Were the City to commit to the supplement for 2011, the cost of the twelve monthly ads would be \$8,568.00, inclusive of HST. The funds would be allocated from the Committees, Boards, and Commissions budget.

4.0 SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION

In an effort to improve communications with the Burnaby public about Community Policing and crime prevention, a two-page monthly insert in the *Burnaby NewsLeader* was initiated in 2009 October. To date, thirteen editions have been published, with each edition reaching an estimated circulation of 46,000 households. The City's commitment to the supplement has been to provide editorial content, review the layout of each edition, and purchase twelve monthly 3/8 page advertisements at an annual cost of \$8,568.00. The Communications Subcommittee of the Community Policing Committee proposes that the City continue to invest in the monthly supplement, and that the current format be maintained for 2011. Sufficient budget funds of \$8,568.00 are available in the 2011 Committees, Boards, and Commissions budget for the advertisements to accompany the supplement during 2011.

It is recommended that the Committee request Council to approve funding for twelve City advertisements in 2011 to accompany the Community Policing supplement in the *Burnaby NewsLeader*.

It is further recommended that Tracy Keenan, publisher of the *Burnaby NewsLeader*, be informed in writing of Council's decision.
