PURPOSE: To seek approval for the 2011 Environment Week program.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

REPORT

1.0 BACKGROUND

Environment Week is an annual event that takes place across Canada to promote and celebrate the natural environment. The City of Burnaby, through the Environment Committee, participates in Environment Week by coordinating a number of public events led by the City, community groups and other organizations to promote and celebrate the environment in Burnaby. This year, Environment Week is scheduled for Sunday June 5th to Saturday June 11th with World Environment Day on Saturday June 5th and Clean Air Day on Wednesday June 8th.

This report outlines planned Environment Week events that offer a number of opportunities for public participation, education and celebration. The program was developed with the citizen representatives of the Environment Committee.

2.0 2011 ENVIRONMENT WEEK PROPOSED PROGRAM

Three main components are scheduled this year for Burnaby Environment Week. The first is the celebratory event for the completion of the Burnaby Lake Rejuvenation Project. This will be held at the Burnaby Lake Rowing Pavilion together with presentations of the annual Burnaby Environmental Awards. The second component involves this year's theme of "Waste Reduction – making a difference". This includes a proposed community-wide Garage Sale Day Event, a proposed Energy Education Pilot

Program and an evening lecture with guest speaker, SFU Professor Anthony Perl. The third main component scheduled for this year involves a complimentary group of valuable environmental activities and events which contribute to Environment Week and help raise awareness of Burnaby's natural environment.

2.1 BURNABY LAKE REJUVINATION PROJECT AND ENVIRONMENT AWARDS

This year, an event to celebrate the completion of the Rejuvenation Project in Burnaby Lake is proposed. Scheduled for Sunday June 12 at the Burnaby Lake Rowing Pavilion, anticipated activities include presentations and refreshments as well as other possible programming on site such as dragonboat demonstrations, canoe rides and other activities. Presentations for the 2011 Burnaby Environment Awards will also be held at this time to acknowledge the individuals and groups who have substantially contributed to Burnaby's environment.

The Burnaby Lake Rejuvenation project has restored the open water for preservation of the diverse ecosystem and re-established the rowing course to international standards for training and events at Burnaby Lake. The project involved removal of 180,000 cubic metres of lakebed material. Significant effort was placed in monitoring and regulatory compliance to ensure minimal impact to the environment during the removal of lakebed material.

Council expenditure approval of \$5,000 from the Boards, Committees and Commission is recommended for this celebratory event. The Clerks Department has advised that there are sufficient funds available for this purpose.

2.2 WASTE REDUCTION – MAKING A DIFFERENCE

As approved by Council through the recommendation of the Environment Committee on 2011 February 21, this year's Environment Week theme is "Waste Reduction – making a difference". The goal is to focus on providing greater awareness for the public on the topic of waste reduction in Burnaby. Accordingly, a number of the proposed community events provide opportunities for participants to learn more about waste reduction and waste reduction choices at home, work and play.

As noted above, a community-wide Garage Sale Day Event Program is a new event proposed this year to encourage Burnaby residents to reduce waste and reuse household items. This program invites Burnaby residents to host their own private garage sale on Saturday 2011 June 11 during Environment Week and to register their civic address for their garage sale with the City.

City staff will promote the program and a list of submitted residential garage sale addresses in the two local newspapers, on City webpages and at civic facilities. A map of participating garage sales will also be displayed on the City website for public viewing. Information material including garage sale responsibilities, guidelines, tips and signage will be provided to all program participants. The community-wide Garage Sale Day is scheduled for Saturday 2011 June 11 from 9am to 1pm and will be organized under the auspices of the Engineering Department with assistance from other City staff.

Additional waste reduction themed activities include an evening lecture with Professor Anthony Perl, Director of the Urban Studies Program at SFU, a documentary film screening of the "Clean Bin Project" at Bob Prittie Metrotown Branch Library, a proposed Energy Education Pilot Program, three community swap-meet events at Burnaby's community centres, and themed information displays at Burnaby's public libraries.

2.3 COMPLIMENTARY ENVIRONMENT ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

This year's one-day public Environmental Festival event is scheduled to take place on Saturday 2011 June 11 at the Metrotown Civic Square with environmental displays, live music featuring the band "Highrise Lonesome" and barbeque. Burnaby Food Services will operate the barbeque and demonstrate their environmentally friendly food choices and initiatives.

Other Environment Week events and activities include Bike to Work Week, a Clean Air Day commuter challenge and electric vehicle display, a Burnaby Public Library documentary film screening on the topic of water and two public Burnaby Mountain guided hiking tours.

The following list outlines the scope of proposed events for 2011 Environment Week. A more detailed schedule and description of events is provided in *Appendix A*, *attached*.

3.0 SPONSORSHIP AND ADVERTISING

Corporate sponsorship of Environment Week events and activities has been a significant component in previous years and City staff are currently in discussion with previous sponsors and pursuing new prospects.

Tim Hortons has graciously agreed this year to again contribute \$3,000 and their 'community cruiser' towards Environment Week activities. At this time, a new sponsor for 2011, Grand & Toy, has also generously agreed to make donation towards Environment Week this year.

Information material promoting 2011 Environment Week will be advertised in the two local newspapers and one regional newspaper, circulated to civic facilities and placed on City webpages. Information material introducing and promoting the Garage Sale Day Event program, including the listing of registered civic addresses, will also be advertised in the two local newspapers, placed on the City webpages and displayed at civic facilities.

Council expenditure approval of \$15,500 from the Boards, Committees and Commission is recommended for Environment Week to provide for advertising and event signage. The Clerks Department has advised that there are sufficient funds for this purpose.
