REPORT

The Finance and Civic Development Committee, at its meeting held on 2011 June 21, received and adopted the <u>attached</u> report seeking Council approval to proceed with the Griffiths pedestrian overpass special lighting project.

The proposed lighting improvements will provide supplemental blue LED light fixtures to contrast with white metal halide lights to create the visual effect of a white iconic arch floating on a blue base. This will enhance the aesthetics of the bridge structure, creating a special landmark and unique gateway to visitors and returning residents when entering the City.

Sufficient Capital Reserves Funds are available and these expenditures are included in the Structures component of the 2011 Annual Financial Plan.

IMPROVEMENT

PURPOSE:

To seek the approval of the Committee and Council to proceed with the Griffiths

pedestrian overpass special lighting project.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. **THAT** the Committee recommend Council to:

- a. Approve expenditures of \$180,000 (inclusive of 12% HST) for the Griffiths pedestrian overpass special lighting project, as outlined in this report;
- b. Bring down a Capital Reserves Bylaw in the amount of \$180,000 (inclusive of 12% HST) to finance this project.

REPORT

Council, at its regular meeting of 2010 December 06, approved the conceptual lighting enhancement (see Figure 1) proposed for the Griffith's pedestrian overpass and directed staff to include funding of \$350,000 in the 2011 Capital Program.

Griffiths Dr is one of the City's main arterials connecting Kingsway to Marine Way and New Westminster. In 2008, a pedestrian overpass was constructed at 14th Ave to provide a safe passage for pedestrian and cyclists crossing Griffiths Dr and connects the trail network in the Southpoint/Taylor Park neighbourhood to the walkways leading to Byrne Creek Secondary School. The overpass has a modern and striking design and received a "Project of the Year" award from the BC Public Works Association.

The proposed lighting improvements will provide supplemental blue LED light fixtures to contrast with white metal halide lights to create the visual effect of a white iconic arch floating on a blue base. This will enhance the aesthetics of the bridge structure, creating a special landmark and unique gateway to visitors and returning residents when entering the City.

Total project costs have now been more closely defined through the design process and are estimated at \$180,000 (inclusive of 12% HST). However, to enable work to proceed in a timely manner, it is recommended that the Committee and Council approve the proposed lighting improvements and that this project be funded from Capital Reserves. Sufficient Capital Reserves Funds are available and these expenditures are included in the Structures component of the 2011 Annual Financial Plan.
