## **REPORT**

The Community Heritage Commission, at its meeting held on 2012 November 01, received and adopted the <u>attached</u> report, in response a request for the designation of the George S. Vickers Residence as a City Heritage Site. The property is a high-quality Craftsman style bungalow which forms a landmark in East Burnaby. It was built in 1911 for George S. Vickers, a prominent Burnaby resident who worked as an employee of the British Columbian newspaper in New Westminster. The house is currently listed on Burnaby's Community Heritage Register – Inventory.

**PURPOSE:** 

To seek authorization for preparation of a report for the designation of the George

S. Vickers Residence as a City Heritage Site.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

**1. THAT** staff be authorized to prepare a report for the designation the George S. Vickers Residence as a City Heritage Site.

### REPORT

Appearing on the Community Heritage Commission's 2012 November 01 agenda is a letter from Mrs. Gwen Rumble, the registered property owner of 7686 First Street. Mrs. Rumble is requesting the City's consideration for the designation of the George S. Vickers Residence as a City Heritage Site.

The property is a high-quality Craftsman style bungalow which forms a landmark in East Burnaby at the corner of First Street and Thirteenth Avenue. It was built in 1911 for George S. Vickers, a prominent Burnaby resident who worked as an employee of The British Columbian newspaper in New Westminster. The house is in excellent condition, with only minor alterations to its original construction, and is currently listed on Burnaby's Community Heritage Register – Inventory (see *Attachment #1*).

With the concurrence of the Community Heritage Commission, staff would work with the property owner to prepare a detailed Heritage Designation Bylaw report to protect the Vickers Residence as a City Heritage Site. The report would be submitted to a future meeting of the Commission for consideration.
