SUBJECT: FRASER RIVER DYKE FLOOD PROTECTION

**PURPOSE:** To seek funding approval from the Committee and Council to proceed with the

2012/2013 Fraser River Dyke Rehabilitation Program.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

**1. THAT** the Committee recommend Council to:

- a. approve expenditures of \$5.040 Million (exclusive of 12% HST) for the Fraser River Dyke rehabilitation project, as outlined in this report;
- b. allocate \$5.040 Million (inclusive of 12% HST) from the Gaming Fund Reserves to finance this project.

#### **REPORT**

Council, at its regular meeting of 2012 February 06, received a report from the Director Engineering that provided an overview of a Building Canada Fund – Flood Protection Program grant for the ongoing Fraser River Dyke rehabilitation project (*Attachment A*). The grant, up to a maximum of \$3.36 Million in federal/provincial funding, is available for upgrades to several reaches of Fraser River Dyke in the Big Bend area. The Program is administered by Emergency Management BC (EMBC) and a fully executed project agreement is expected to be in place by the end of this month. The Building Canada Fund – Flood Protection Program provides an ideal opportunity for the City to cost-share with federal and provincial governments in upgrading the flood protection infrastructure in the Big Bend floodplain area.

Staff have identified a program of dyke improvement works for implementation over the period 2012 April – 2013 December, to meet a 2014 February 28 completion deadline established by EMBC. Total project cost is estimated at \$5.040 Million exclusive of 12% HST and will be expended in 2012 and 2013 The City's share of total cost is 33% (\$1.64 Million). However, it is necessary to interim finance total project expenditures and, as the work proceeds, invoice the province on a quarterly basis. In order for the project to proceed in a timely manner, it is recommended that the Committee and Council approve the proposed dyke improvements and




Figure 1 - Building Canada Flood Protection Program 2012 - 2013
