SUBJECT: BYLAW TO FUND PARKS, RECREATION & CULTURAL SERVICES

2013 CAPITAL PROJECTS

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- **1. THAT** the expenditure of \$830,000 from the Annual Capital Budget for the projects outlined in this report be approved.
- **2. THAT** Council be requested to bring down a bylaw to appropriate \$868,785 (inclusive of 5% GST) from Capital Reserves to finance these projects.

REPORT

The 2013 Annual Capital Budget for Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services contains the following 7 projects to be funded from Capital Reserves. To enable work to go ahead on these projects, approval is requested to bring down a bylaw for funding.

1. Central Park \$250,000

The comprehensive safety review of Central Park recommended the relocation of south west parking lot from inside the park to a location along Imperial that was on the peripheral edge of the park. The relocation removes the safety issue of cars having to ramp up the slope while crossing a pedestrian pathway. The funds will be used to survey an optimal location that will integrate the new urban perimeter trail with parking lot entry and exit locations, provide conceptual and detail design, and construction.

2. Burnaby Mountain

80,000

Replacement of City owned power poles above the parking lot on Burnaby Mountain. Poles are 40+ years old and are in need of replacement.

3. Spray Parks

200,000

Improvements and upgrades to spray parks for life cycle replacement and Fraser Health (FHA) regulations. (Charles Rummel, Suncrest, Rene Parks)

4. Worksafe BC Chlorine Improvement

100,000

Retrofit of chlorine systems at the City pools as required by Worksafe BC. This project will retrofit the pools gas chlorine rooms to provide for liquid chlorine for staff and public safety.

5. Confederation Centre

20,000

Interior fit outs at the Centre to include items such as window coverings, program fixtures/furniture, interior painting and lighting.

6. Willingdon Centre

30,000

Interior fit outs at the Centre to include items such as program equipment, window coverings, community room upgrades, interior painting and floor treatment.

7. Shade Structures

150,000

Installation of shade structures in coordination with recreation program needs in various locations (spray parks, playgrounds, etc.) throughout the Park system

Sufficient Capital Reserves are available to complete the above projects in the 2013 Annual Capital Budget. It is recommended that Council be requested to bring down a bylaw to appropriate \$868,785 (inclusive of 5% GST) from Capital Reserves to finance these projects.
