SUBJECT: ENERGY PERFORMANCE PROGRAM – FUNDING

**PURPOSE:** To obtain funding approval for the implementation of energy conservation

projects at various City facilities

### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

**1. THAT** the Committee recommend Council to approve expenditures of \$250,000 from the 2014 Provisional Budget for the Energy Performance Program, as outlined in this report.

**2. THAT** the Committee recommend Council to allocate \$261,683 (inclusive of GST) from the Gaming Funds Reserves to finance the program projects.

### REPORT

The 2014 Provisional Financial Plan includes provision of \$250,000 for the ongoing annual Energy Performance Program to be funded from Gaming Funds Reserves. The program is targeted toward energy use reduction through the replacement of older electrical components with modern higher efficiency equipment. The proposed improvements would reduce; electrical consumption, operational maintenance costs, and green house gases. The equipment replacement will also contribute towards the equipment life cycle renewal for the facilities. For 2014, the facilities targeted for the Energy Performance Program include; libraries, recreation centres, fire halls, cultural buildings, and City Hall grounds.

The City funding for this program is partnered with BC Hydro Power Smart funding. In 2013, BC Hydro's contribution is estimated to be \$110,000 or approximately 25% to 30% of the project costs depending on the energy reduction achieved. It is proposed that the BC Hydro rebates be carried forward to fund additional 2014 energy reduction projects.
