Monday, 2014 November 03

An 'Open' meeting of the City Council was held in the COUNCIL CHAMBER, BURNABY CITY HALL, 4949 Canada Way, Burnaby, B.C. on Monday, 2014 November 03 at 6:36 PM followed immediately by a 'Closed' meeting from which the public was excluded. At the conclusion of the 'Closed' meeting, the 'Open' meeting was reconvened at 7:05 PM in the Council Chamber.

Mr. Nokony further advised that attendance at the museum has increased by 400% since the introduction of free admission. Mr. Nokony also noted that interest from corporate donors has grown and partnership relationships have blossomed.

Mr. Nokony presented the award, a sculpture by a BC artist, to His Worship, Mayor Derek Corrigan.

- A) Ms. Grace Browning, Branch 148 and Mr. Tom Waddel, and Ms. Carol MacKenzie, Branch 83, Royal Canadian Legion, appeared before Council regarding the importance of acknowledging and honouring Canadian citizens who gave their lives in service to our country. The delegation also noted that Remembrance Day ceremonies will be held at the North Burnaby Cenotaph at Confederation Park and the South Burnaby Cenotaph at Bonsor Park.
- B) Mr. Sean Rodrigues, 4811 Highlawn Drive, Burnaby and Mr. Frank Ong, 4821 Highlawn Drive, Burnaby appeared before Council presenting a petition containing 58 signatures from residents of Highlawn Drive, Midlawn Drive and Beta Avenue in opposition to the routing of a Fortis Gas pipeline through the Brentwood Park neighbourhood. The speakers noted the pipeline should be routed through an industrial area rather than a residential neighbourhood. The delegation expressed concern regarding the Fortis BC stakehoulder consultation process particularly with the local neighbourhood. Mr. Rodrigues and Mr. Ong requested the City appoint a liaison to capture and co-ordinate resident concerns. The delegation also requested the City ask Fortis BC to provide alternative routing options that focus on industrial land use.

B) Finance and Civic Development Committee Re: Temporary Financing Bylaw

The Finance and Civic Development Committee submitted a report seeking Council borrowing authority to temporarily finance expenditures. Temporary borrowing sometimes becomes necessary during the year prior to collection of property taxes and at other times to make large unexpected payments or to cover an overdraft resulting from revenue shortfalls. Section 177 of the Community Charter provides that Council may authorize borrowing of this nature through a bylaw.

The Finance and Civic Development Committee recommended:

1. THAT Council authorize staff to bring down a bylaw to permit borrowing of up to \$2 million as required, during the period 2015 January 01 to December 31, repayable 2015 December 31.

The Finance and Civic Development Committee submitted a report providing Council with a recommendation of the appointment of Manager, Treasury Operations to the Board of Directors for Tourism Burnaby. Since the formation of Tourism Burnaby by City Council, Tourism Burnaby has successfully promoted global awareness of sporting and business meeting opportunities available in Burnaby. While the administration and sales activities to generate and increase tourism in Burnaby has been assigned to Tourism Burnaby, the City maintains a fiduciary responsibility of oversight. This is accomplished in part through the appointment of a staff member to the Board of Directors.

The Finance and Civic Development Committee recommended:

1. THAT Council appoint Mr. Doug Spindler, Manager, Treasury Operations to the Board of Directors for Tourism Burnaby as Director and voting member.

7. MANAGER'S REPORTS

1. PROPOSED TRANS MOUNTAIN EXPANSION PROJECT

The City Manager submitted a report from the Directors Planning & Building, Engineering and the City Solicitor providing Council with an update and a summary of key actions taken by the City to-date with respect to the proposed Trans Mountain Pipeline Expansion Project. The City's opposition to this project is framed by its concern for all citizens, the environment, and the protection of the community from the detrimental impacts of Kinder Morgan's proposed project. The City is in the process of filing an appeal with the Federal Court of Appeal. This appeal will challenge the National Energy Board Ruling and Order to over-ride Burnaby's bylaw and grant Kinder Morgan the right to cause damage to the Burnaby Mountain Conservation Area.
