PURPOSE: To seek funding approval for the hosting of an 11-member delegation from

Burnaby's Sister City of Mesa, Arizona from September 4-7, 2014.

RECOMMENDATION:

1. THAT the International Relations and Friendship Cities Committee request Council approval for expenses related to the hosting of an 11-member delegation from Burnaby's Sister City of Mesa, Arizona, as outlined in this report.

REPORT

At the International Relations and Friendship Cities Committee meeting held on 2014 January 9, the Committee received correspondence from Mr. Robert Shultz, Chair, Burnaby Committee for Mesa Sister Cities Association, initiating discussion of a possible Sister City delegation visit to Burnaby in 2014 to celebrate 15 years of formal relations between the two cities.

Arising from further correspondence between Burnaby and Mesa staff, a formal letter of invitation was issued from Mayor Derek Corrigan inviting Mesa's Mayor, Council Members, and Senior Staff to visit Burnaby from September 4-7, 2014 as part of the reciprocal hosting arrangements under the Sister City agreement.

Correspondence from Mesa Mayor Alex Finter was received in May, 2014 expressing the acceptance of the invitation and indicating that the Mesa delegation would be led by Mesa's Vice-Mayor and be composed of City Council Members, Senior City Executives, and Mesa Sister City Board Members.

A detailed itinerary was prepared to reflect the interests and specializations of the visiting delegation to maximize opportunities for mutual learning and the sharing of best municipal practices in the City of Burnaby. As well, other opportunities were arranged for sharing Burnaby's strengths in the areas of Arts and Culture, Economic Development, Education, Healthcare, Parks and Environment, Heritage Preservation, and Tourism.
