A) Alexandra Lezo

Re: Request for Zoning Bylaw Amendments

Alexandra Lezo, 5808 Portland Street, Burnaby appeared before Council requesting that pygmy goats be allowed to be kept on R2 properties that meet specific guidelines. Ms. Lezo addressed health, safety and noise concerns regarding pygmy goats, and listed the benefits of pygmy goats in urban areas.

The delegation proposed a pilot project to test the keeping of pet pygmy goats in Burnaby. During this period, bylaw guidelines, such as licensing and minimum requirements for the keeping of pet pygmy goats, could be developed.

In conclusion, Ms. Lezo requested Council direct staff to investigate the legalization and reclassification of pygmy goats as small domestic pets in the City of Burnaby and implementation of a detailed bylaw as outlined in her proposed pilot project. The delegation also requested the legalization of two pygmy goats she currently owns based on their unique circumstances.

Mr. Khalid Boudreau, 5786 Portland Street, Burnaby appeared before Council in support of Ms. Lezo's request to keep two pygmy goats on her property.
