The couple immigrated to Canada in 1910. Their son, James Francis Shearer, was born shortly after the picture was taken, on April 11, 1913 (died April 24, 1997 in London, England). The house was commissioned by Katherine's father, Francis Joseph Dormer, who published newspapers in South Africa. The couple later divorced and returned to the UK around the end of the decade.
