Photograph of James Dykes (Jim) Shearer, his wife Katherine (Dormer), and their daughter, Katie posed in front of the temporary shelter erected at 5573 Buckingham Avenue during the construction of their home on that site. The coupled immigrated to Canada in 1910. Their son, James Francis Shearer, was born shortly after the picture was taken, on April 11, 1913 (died Aril 24, 1997 in London, England). The house was commissioned by Katherine's father, Francis Joseph Dormer, who published

newspapers in South Africa. The couple later divorced and returned to the UK around

the end of the decade.
